



I, **Isaac Richards** of Georgetown Township, Floyd County, Indiana do hereby make and publish this my last Will & Testament.

1. I will and bequeath unto my 2 sons **James M. Richards**, and **William Richards** \$400 cash .

I will and bequeath unto the heirs of **Elizabeth Crandall** \$400 cash, said amount to be divided equally among said heirs.

I will and bequeath unto the **heirs of Margaret Engleman** \$400 cash , said amount to be divided equally among said heirs.

I will and bequeath unto the **heirs of Mary Engleman** \$400, said amount to be divided equally among said heirs.

I have given to my 2 sons **George W. Richards** and **Henry Richards** \$400 each.

I have also given unto my 2 daughters **Martha J. Dyer** and **Catherine Tyler** \$400 each.

2. Should I at any future time pay off any of the amount above bequeathed, the receipts for such shall be shown to my Executor hereafter named, that the same has been paid.

3. I will and devise that my Executor shall pay out of my estate such amount for grave stone or monuments that my heirs will place at my grave, provided the same will not exceed \$40.

This is some biographic information for the four men whose Perry Co. IN land purchases at the Vincennes Land Office were listed in the October 2009 quarterly. These were adjacent properties in Anderson Twp., Perry Co. IN.

**Miles Terry**

**Miles Terry** was born 11 Mar 1809 in Anderson Co., Tennessee and died 4 Jul 1880 Perry Co. IN. He was one of fourteen children of **John Terry**, Rev. War soldier (b. ca 1760, d. 1842 Perry Co.) and **Esther (Brown)**. After the Rev. War, they moved their family from Botetourt Co. Virginia to Anderson Co., Tennessee. They migrated about 1815 on pack horses to Anderson Township, Perry Co., Indiana. Some of their children remained in Tennessee. **John** and **Esther** (1764-1847) are buried in the Terry Family Cemetery on the Terry farm in Anderson Co., Perry Co., where his military marker was dedicated in June 1985.

**Miles Terry** married 31 Mar 1830 in Gibson Co. to **Nancy M. Baswell** (b. 25 Jun 1803 in North Carolina, d. 21 Jun 1865). They had nine children: **Aaron, Margaret, Lucinda** (who married **William Hicks** and moved to Henry Co., Missouri about 1871-1880), **Esther, John Newton** (died 15 Dec 1864 at Nashville, Tennessee in the Civil War), **Clara, Mary Ann, Louisa** (married John **Richard Anderson**), and **Sarah Jane** (m1 **Thomas T. Cummings**, m2 **Adam Glenn**). Several of their children died young.

He married 19 Nov 1865 **Cynthiann (Bennett) Walker** (1832-1905) and they had seven children: **Henry Sheridan, Aaron, George, Margarah, Clara, Mary Ann, and Esther**. **Miles** and his first wife, **Nancy**, are buried in the Wheatley/Terry Cemetery in Anderson Twp. His second wife, **Cynthiann** is buried in the Methodist Cemetery, near Hagedorn, Anderson Township. Most of his children stayed in Perry Co., where there are still many descendants.

The Terry Family History by **Lula Terry Elliott** includes this family story:  
 "About 1834 **John Terry** gave **Miles Terry** the purchase price to buy a 40 acre homestead for him on a trip to Vincennes, Ind. Miles took title in his own name, but after John's death Miles and his wife deeded it to **Esther** and she in turn conveyed the land back to Miles in 1847. The land was located ¾ mile east of the Lily Dale Church."

**Harvey and Peter Barger**

**Harvey Barger**, b. 1820 Breckinridge Co., KY, d. 21 Feb 1901 Cooter Township, Pemiscot Co., Missouri, married 1 Dec 1848 to **Esther Terry** (b. 28 Nov 1828 Perry Co., IN – d. 28 Apr 1888 Pemiscot Co., MO), dau of **Elias Terry**, granddaughter of **John Terry**, Rev. War soldier. She was a niece of **Miles Terry**.


**Harvey** and **Esther** were listed in the 1850 census of Anderson Twp., Perry Co., but moved to Independence, Dunklin Co. Missouri before 1860 and were parents of seven children: **William Penn, Susan, Mary E., Nancy, Lavina, Ann, and Abraham L. Peter Barger**, age 26, was also listed in their household in 1850.

On 15 Nov 1854 **Harvey Barger** of Perry Co., Indiana purchased 80 acres at Jackson, Dunklin Co., MO. Another purchase of 40 acres the same day, he gave his residence as Dunklin Co. MO.

**Peter Barger**, b . 18 Aug 1823 Breckinridge Co., KY, d. 1880 Springfield, Greene Co. Missouri. He was listed in the 1900 census of Cooter, Pemiscot Co., MO, b. Mar 1820 , age 80, widow, b . KY, parents b. KY, as the father in the household of **A. [Abraham] L.** and **Mollie Barger**. In the same household, listed as brother was **R. E. [Richard Edward] Barger**, b. Sep 1833 KY. At least two brothers, **Philip** and **Richard Edward Barger**, migrated to Missouri.

An anc.com website listed Harvey Barger's death as 21 Feb 1901, Cooter Twp., Pemiscot Co., MO, buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery, Pemiscot Co., and Peter Barger d. 1880 Springfield, Green Co. MO.

**Harvey** and **Peter Barger** were two sons of the twelve children of **George Barger** ( b. 1797 PA, d. 1859 Perry Co., IN) and his first wife **Malissa Susanna Shelman** (b ca 1792 PA, d. 1846 Perry Co.,) who were first cousins. **George Barger** married second on 16 Jan 1849 to **Martha ( ) Salmon**. **George Barger** and his wives do not have marked graves listed in Perry Co. IN cemeteries.

### **Jonathan Hendershot**

**Jonathan Hendershot**, b. 1797 Greene Co. Pennsylvania, d. 17 Apr 1882 in Anderson Twp., Perry Co. IN. He married **Elizabeth Hammond** (b. 1800 VA, d. 1854 Liberty Twp., Washington Co., Ohio) where a Probate record of Apr 1854 listed her heirs: husband **Jonathan Hendershot**; children **Francis M., Louisa, Lucinda, Jonathan Jr., Chauncey, and Perry M.** They were listed in the 1850 census of that county with children: **Stilwell G., Susannah, Francis, Louisa, Lucinda, Jonathan, Isaac C., and Hiram P. Stilwell** and **Susanna** may have been children of a marriage before **Elizabeth**.

**Jonathan** was a son of **John Hendershot**, Rev. War veteran who lived in Green Co. PA and later moved to Monroe Co., Ohio.

**Jonathan** and his son **Stilwell** of Perry Co. IN purchased adjoining land in Perry Co. 30 May 1858. In the 1860 census of Anderson Twp., Perry Co. he was listed with his second wife, **Martha**, age 56, b. Scotland, who had three children by a previous marriage. The 1866 Tax Assessment listed **Jonathan**, of Lily Dale, Perry Co., as Keeper of Jack, taxed \$10.00.

The **Hendershots** came to Anderson Twp. from Ohio about the same time as several other families. **Jonathan** may be buried in the **Covey** Cemetery in an unmarked grave near his sons **Stilwell** and **Jonathan, Jr.** and their wives.
